

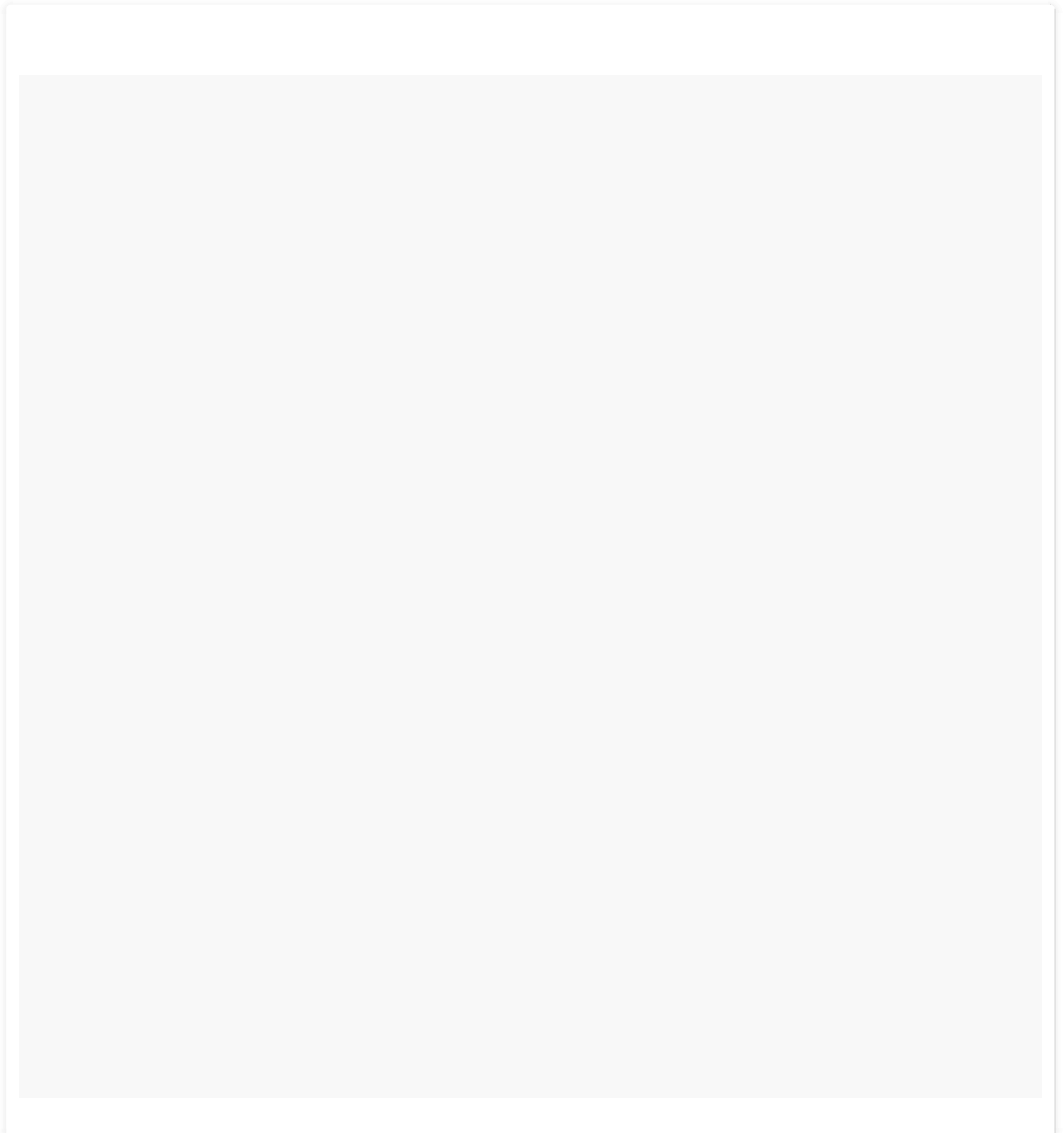
Color the Globe Purple for World Pancreatic Cancer Day
